Terry Ware will baste it and then it will be at Lakeside Hospice for people to quilt it doing big stitch.
It will be brought back here when it is done. Peggy Williams suggested we photograph it

for the newspaper.

Peggy has more fabric for the binding. Antoinette thanks everyone who helped with making the parts.

Mayor Bill Herford wants a crimson and white double sized quilt for himself. He will make a considerable donation to the guild for the quilt. The mayor is the one that told the civic center that we can have city facilities for our meetings and sew days. Celisia has some Alabama fabric she can donate, as does Terry Russell. We should bring appropriate material from our stash to the meeting next month. Then we can decide if we need to buy additional.

The Opportunity Quilt is done. Top was made by Margaret Gullledge. It is all hand quilted by our various members. Antoinette suggested that whoever sells the most tickets gets a free membership. Terry Ware suggested we sent postcards to members of the Chamber of commerce advertizing the quilt. We will have packets with 25 tickets. when you sell those, you can come back and get another packet. Carole said that whoever sells the most tickets will get something better than a years membership.

Jackie White showed a rail fence prayer quilt. It is very pretty.

Donna Nicholson showed a prayer quilt out of pre-cut pieces.

Terry Russell commented that we need to turn in forms for the prayer quilts that we do and give away.

Terry Ware reminded us that the forms are available at our web site.

Peggy Williams and Brenda Franklin passed out background fabric for the remaining

blocks of the month. May's block is Album Variation. NOTE COLOR 1 is WHITE.

COLOR 2 is 30's fabrics.
