Peggy Williams demonstrated how to make the June block of the month: Bridal Path. Remember to use the baggie with your name on it when you turn in your block. If you made the commitment to do block of the month, please keep up to date on them. Even if you are not coming to a meeting, you should have a way to turn it in for the meeting. Someone will win the blocks and it would be nice if they had them all at the time of the drawing. That would lighten the burden of record keeping that Peggy and Brenda have to do for this fun block exchange.

Show and tell: Jackie White showed her black, white & red purse and her Carpenter's Star quilt top done in batiks with a black background. Beth Staples showed a gingham baby quilt she's giving to New Life Center and an Alabama quilt . Brenda Franklin showed her 1930's Square Deal queen size quilt. It took her 3 months to hand quilt it. She also showed her queen size Carpenter's Star. Peggy Williams showed her Carpenter's star that has a scrappy inner border which is carried around the corners. She recommends you not use a directional fabric within the star. Florence Kerr showed her purple sweatshirt which she made for her mother for mother's day. Rachel Bates showed a ragged blocks baby's blanket. Sally Day showed two baby quilts which she made for shower gifts. One is an hour glass in squares; the other a bowtie. They are hand quilted. Peggy White showed her queen size carpenter's star. Irene Dison showed her carpenter's star quilt top in reds rusts and green on a tan (suede looking) background. Mary Casey donated a teddy bear and nine patch for Project Linus. Non-member Paula Greggs donated a purple one for Project Linus. Debbie Maddy's web site is calicocarriage.com and she has free patterns there.
